## Appendix A

Fantastic Television Limited (Fantastic TV) has committed that on top of the programme requirements stipulated under its current domestic free television programme (free TV) service licence, it would fulfil additional programme requirements when the proposed transmission arrangement comes into effect as follows –

## **On the Integrated Chinese and English Channels**

- (a) <u>Children's programmes<sup>1</sup></u> Fantastic TV would start to broadcast an additional one hour daily of children's programmes on the integrated Chinese channel upon use of spectrum. On the integrated English channel, Fantastic TV shall gradually increase the amount of children's programmes by an additional one hour daily within 12 months upon use of spectrum;
- (b) <u>Documentary programmes<sup>2</sup></u> Fantastic TV would start to broadcast, on the integrated English channel, 30 minutes per week of documentary programmes which are to be wholly of Hong Kong origin within 12 months upon use of spectrum;

(c) <u>Subtitling service<sup>3</sup></u> – Fantastic TV would provide Chinese subtitles for all drama programmes carried on the integrated Chinese channel upon use of spectrum. English subtitling would be gradually extended to all programmes broadcast between 8:00 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on its integrated English channel within 12 months upon use of spectrum;

## **On the Additional TV Programme Channel**

- (d) <u>Daily broadcasting hours and channel language</u> The additional TV programme channel would broadcast a total of 21 hours of TV programmes per day mainly in Cantonese;
- (e) <u>Local productions<sup>4</sup></u> Fantastic TV would provide not less than 100 hours of local productions per week;
- (f) <u>First-run programmes<sup>5</sup></u> Fantastic TV would provide 110 hours of firstrun programmes per week;

<sup>(</sup>c) on the integrated English channel, English subtitles for two hours per week of programmes with educational value targeting teenagers.

- (g) <u>Subtitling service</u> Fantastic TV would provide Chinese subtitles, whenever feasible, for news and documentary programmes broadcast in languages other than Cantonese; and
- (h) <u>Announcement in the public interest and Communications Authority (CA)</u> <u>publicity material</u> – The additional TV programme channel would broadcast announcements in the public interest up to two minutes per every two clock hours, and publicity material for the CA up to five minutes per week.

The additional requirements imposed by the CA are to ensure that Fantastic TV, upon using spectrum as an additional transmission means, would operate in more or less a level playing field as the spectrum-based incumbent free TV licensees.
