

To whom it may concern.

I believe that the proposal to divide the above spectrum so that more vendors may be introduced is not to Hong Kong's benefit. We already have a highly competitive market in this area and very satisfactory services that exceed those that I experience in other countries when travelling. This is not a situation of monopoly or even duopoly that needs to be dealt with for the public good.

Given that "the Authority has the statutory duty to promote the efficient allocation and use of spectrum as a public resource of Hong Kong" I believe that the Authority should be most reluctant to introduce additional providers, at the cost of available spectrum to existing providers. Such an introduction can only result in a degradation of the capacity of those existing providers.

Furthermore, if the number of antennae on buildings would be increased by such a move, there is yet another reason to retain the present arrangement.

The existing licenses should be renewed after suitable bidding.

I have no connection with any 3G / 4G telecommunications company other than being a user of two now (3/LTE and CSL/3G) and others in the past.
